This week, on Tuesday afternoon, we held our first Wellbeing session. All teachers were very impressed by the way Year 6 led their groups and also by the participation of all students.



























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ATTENDANCE



In our first week back at school, we had **over 120 late arrivals**. Being late to school, even just by ten minutes can have an effect on your child's entire day.

When children are late, they miss

- opportunities to socialise and play with friends before the bell
- important messages about the day and future events at morning assembly
- morning routines in their classroom that welcome and prepare them for the school day
- important instructions for the first lesson

When children arrive late, they often enter their classroom when everyone is settled and already working. It can be disruptive for the class and unsettling for your child.



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
Please make an effort to have your child arrive on time every day.

ANNUAL PUBLIC SPEAKING COMPETITION Years 1 - 6

Last week, an information pack was sent home with all students. The students will prepare their speeches at home and will be presenting their speeches in class in weeks 4 and 5. School Finals will be held in weeks 6 and 7.

YEAR 1 PHONICS SCREENING CHECK

All Year 1 students in NSW department schools will be required to complete the mandatory Year 1 Phonics Screening Check from 2021. Schools complete the assessment mid Term 3. The 2022 assessment window is 8 - 26 August (Term 3, Weeks 4 - 6)

What is phonics?

Phonics is the relationship between letters and sounds and is vital in learning to read. Some children struggle with learning to read so it is important that these children are identified quickly so teachers can plan for any specific support they may need.

What is the Year 1 Phonics Screening Check?

The Year 1 Phonics Screening Check is a short, quick assessment that tells teachers how your child is progressing in phonics. Your child will sit with the class teacher and will be asked to read 40 words aloud. These words include 20 real words and 20 nonsense words. The test normally takes a few minutes. If your child is struggling the teacher will stop the check. The check is carefully designed not to be stressful for your child.

Why use nonsense words?

The assessment includes pseudo or nonsense words to see if the student is able to use their knowledge of blending to read a word rather than their memory of having seen that word before.
