Reminder: Student Safety Messages

Road Safety

Walking to and from school can be a wonderful, healthy way to incorporate an increased level of health and fitness into the lives of families and students. A number of BHPS students walk to and from school. Of late, our morning assemblies have featured announcements encouraging road safety messaging. This provides support to our students, reminding them of the importance of waiting for the lights to change and walking across the road only when it is safe to do so. I would ask all parents to support our school by re-iterating these important messages. We want all of our students to be safe as they travel to and from school every day.

Child Car Seat Rules

Children aged under 7 years must use an approved suitable child restraint when travelling in a vehicle. A child restraint is a forward-facing or rear-facing child car seat (also referred to as a baby car seat or baby capsule), or a booster seat.

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Arrival and Pick-Up Time

Please be aware that students dropped at school prior to 8:30am remain unsupervised until 8:30am when a teacher is on duty. It is important that students are dropped at school between 8:30am and 9:00am. Please ensure that your child is safe. Do not drop them off at school outside of supervised hours.

The school day finishes for students at 3:00pm. Please ensure that you are on time to collect your child/ren.






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Social Skills
