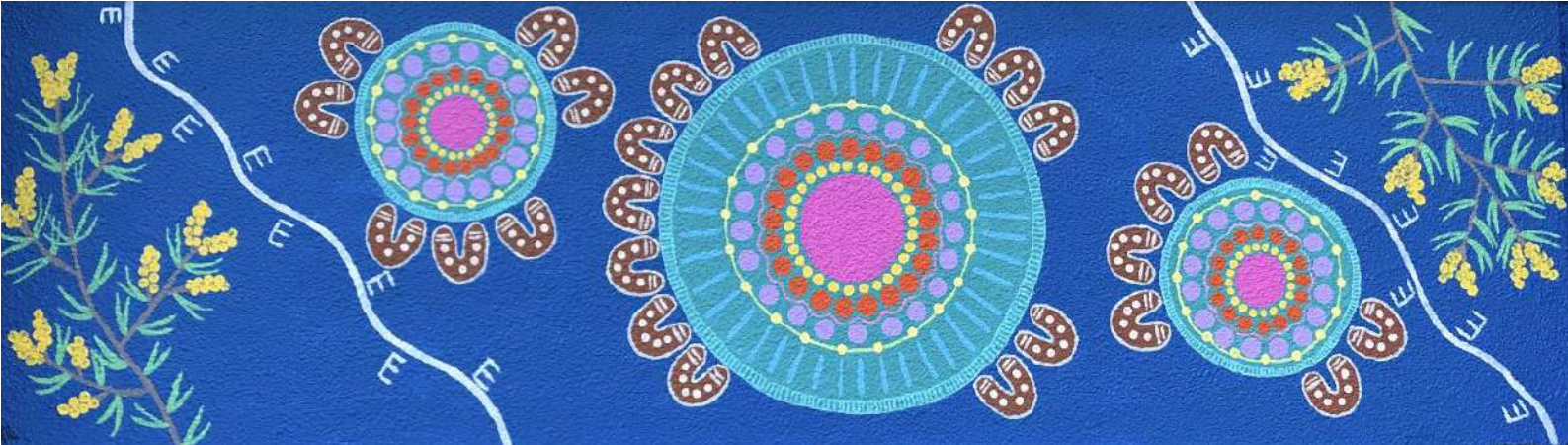




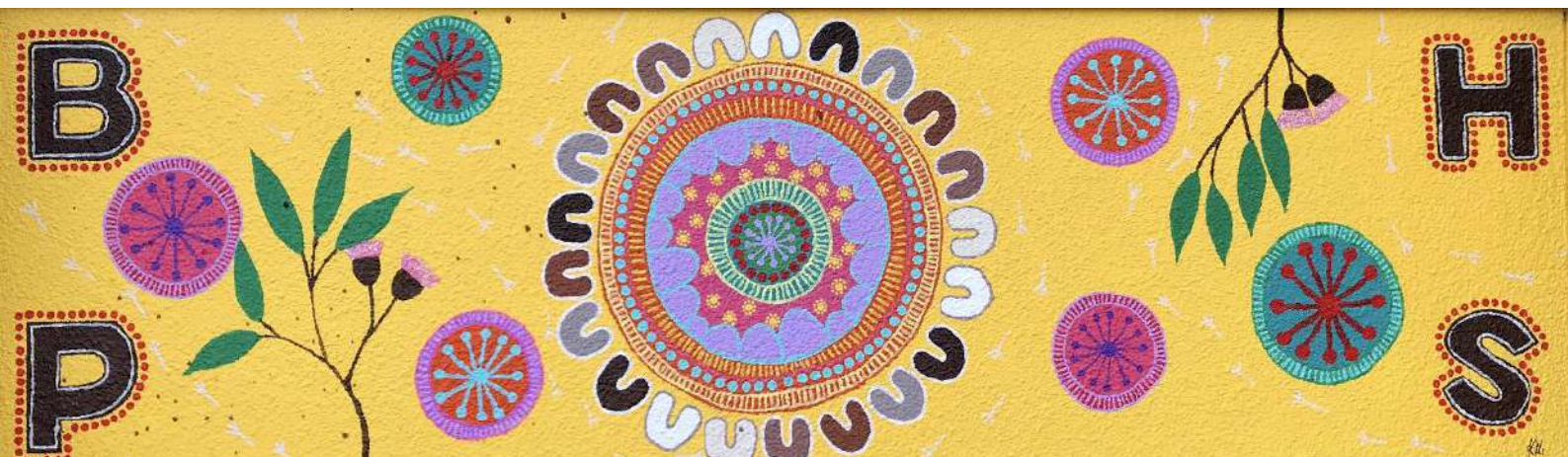

## THE BASS WAY

This year at Bass Hill Public School, we have introduced '**The Bass Way**' - a clear set of expectations for student behaviour.

Each Monday afternoon, the whole school meets in Area A to discuss and role play how to behave 'The Bass Way' - ensuring students have seen and heard how to meet school expectations.

**We have focused on** ..... *responding to the bell, legendary lines, wonderful walking as we move around the school, playing the right games in the right areas and entering and leaving the hall.*

**In class, students have learnt to** ..... *enter the room, demonstrate Bass Quiet, actively listen, use the appropriate Bass Voice, move around the room safely, pack up responsibly and leave the room safely.*

When students are demonstrating 'The Bass Way' behaviours, they are rewarded with Bass Bonuses!

These bonuses are used for weekly prize draws and the fortnightly megabucket draw.

## GREEN DAY or RED DAY

Also, at the end of each day teachers award students with either .....

**Green Day** - if the student has consistently demonstrated 'The Bass Way' behaviours, or

**Red Day** - if the student has not met behaviour expectations.

When a student has had a red day, they are provided with opportunities to reflect on their behaviour and determine ways to improve.



At the end of each term, students who have been awarded green on at least 90% of days, will be acknowledged and rewarded.

This is an opportunity for us, as a school, to recognise and celebrate those students who are contributing to a positive school culture.

Although students who don't achieve 90% green days will miss out on the reward this term, they will have opportunities to relearn and practice 'The Bass Way' behaviours in Term 2. Hopefully, they will be able to achieve above 90% next term.
