



Term 2 Week 7

Student Attendance

A reminder that student attendance at school is compulsory and vital for academic success and wellbeing. It is important that students arrive at school on time every day.


The importance of arriving at school on time:

- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- -Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- Give students time to greet their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age of 17 years. The Education Act 1990 requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school. Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

Have students been demonstrating 'The Bass Way' behaviours?

How many green days have students achieved this semester?

Will they have 90% or more green days at the end of the semester?

At Bass Hill Public School, we have clear expectations in regards to behaviour. At the beginning of each school year, all students collaboratively develop a **'Class Vision'** which outlines what we should see, hear, do and feel in our classrooms. Teachers refer to these expectations often.

Expectations for the playground are discussed each week with students at 'The Bass Way' lessons, by Assistant Principals and class teachers. Students are expected to play in assigned areas, wear a hat, be inclusive, keep hands and feet to themselves and use kind words.

When students have demonstrated the expected behaviours.... they are awarded a **green day.** Students who achieve at or above 90% green days for the semester will be acknowledged with a special 'Bass Bonus' - which this term will be an excursion!

Students who have not achieved 90% green days, will remain at school on that day.

Our special 'Bass Bonus Excursions' will be in Week 10. Invitations will be handed out at the end of Week 9.



The Bass Hill Mob explored Dharug language and traditional symbols for animal tracks through art.














LEARNING SUPPORT - MRS MOSES
