


We at Bass Hill Public School acknowledge the Dharug People as the Traditional Custodians of the land on which we meet, connect, learn and grow on today.



Look at our super fast typers in 3A! This term we have been using Typing Club to practise our typing skills. We are becoming efficient at locating keys on a keyboard.



















4R created posters about Respect and what it means to be respectful in 4R.




English: we have been learning how to write narrative and diamante poems about Fire.

Shared read: We read a variety of books about different natural disasters.




