
Support Unit

Welcome to Stage 2


Stage 2 teachers have welcomed students into their new classes and everyone has quickly settled into routine and learning.


In mathematics students learning to think flexibly with numbers to solve a variety of number problems. They engage in hands on activities on a daily basis to support and develop their mathematical understanding.
